#### ABOUT **DIRK NELDNER**

#### Keynote Speaker

Dirk studied German Philosophy and Political Sciences in Berlin and started his theatre career as a business manager of the independent Junges Theater in Berlin. After that he was responsible for Management and Marketing at Carrousel Theater an der Parkaue, Berlin, the state-owned theatre for Children and Young People. It was there that Dirk Neldner gained his first experiences with international network activities.

From 2009 to 2013 Dirk was head of *Platform11+ Artistic Discoveries in European Schoolyards*, a European theatre network of 13 equally-participating theatres from 12 countries in connection with local cultural organizations, universities and schools. *Platform11+* initiated multidisciplinary cultural efforts (literature, performing and visual arts, new media, cultural education) for and among youth aged 11-15.

Dirk managed the project "*Documents of poverty and hope – a global theatre intervention*", which was supported by the European Commission. Three theatres from Europe (IT, PT, GB), two from Canada (including Presentation House Theatre) and one from Australia joined together to work globally on the theme Poverty and Migration. The resulting international collaborations were performed in countries around the world.

From 2014 to 2018, Dirk designed and managed the pan Europe "*Digital Challenges for Young People in Theatre*", a project involving 11 companies from 9 European Countries. The project contained more than 50 activities that connected theatre makers directly with young people in a creative dialogue. The results of this artistic exchange the network was 40 **co-productions** based on newly developed plays/concepts, correlated to the reality of the digital age.

#### **ABOUT MAUREEN LEE**

#### Keynote Speaker

Maureen's background includes over 20 years of working with children, youth, and families as a teacher, administrator, and elementary counsellor in the public school system. She is currently the District Principal of Student Support Services in the West Vancouver School District and a Registered Clinical Counsellor in private practice. Her school district portfolio includes the areas of Special Education & Counselling, Critical Incident Response, Violent Threat Risk Assessment, Suicide Risk Assessment, Child Abuse Prevention Education, Comprehensive School Health, and Self-Regulation. She believes that educators and counsellors have a moral imperative to improve issues of social justice. She works with staff to increase knowledge, awareness, and practices to make our schools safer and more inclusive for all members of our school community. Maureen's education includes:

#### **HIGH WATER**

#### By Macromatter

**High Water** starts with a fish tank and a 50 gallon drum of water. As water from the drum slowly fills the tank, a performer builds landscapes of everyday objects inside. The play of cause and effect puts tiny worlds into repeated moments of jeopardy and rescue or abandonment. The performer presents every moment as an experiment – some objects float, others sink, some dissolve and disappear, there may be a chain reaction, or maybe something's trapped. The show is an odd and curious inquiry into buoyancy – a series of tests, misfires, and marvels. It is an epic record of civilizations and historic events masquerading as a cheap party trick.
