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DIRECTOR'S NOTES



The journey of **Baking Time** began in London, England where I had the good fortune to meet Tim Webb of Oily Cart Theatre. Tim's company was gaining an international reputation for creating high quality, interactive sensory theatre for very young audiences. Together we had mounted **Patti's Cake**, a favourite Oily Cart production, and were touring it in Ontario. While

working on that show, we were inspired with a new idea: we wanted to explore playing with dough and loved the idea of filling a theatre with the smell of fresh baked bread. The result was **Baking Time**, which toured England and Eastern Canada for over 3 years. This project was always on my list to revisit at Presentation House Theatre, which we did in 2016. Tim and I met that summer to discuss how to make the show even more interactive and fun. Max Reinhardt's music was infectious, so we highlighted it with Joseph Seserko's amazing arrangement for live cello and accordion. Jessica Oostergo further developed Claire de Loon's original set, costume and puppet concepts, and the show was happily received by little North Shore bakers and their families. It then went on to successful runs at the Ottawa International Children's Festival, Toronto's Wee Festival, and the Vancouver International Children's Festival. We're thrilled to bring **Baking Time** home again to you this holiday season. Enjoy!

Kim Selody has worked as a writer, director and actor in Canadian theatre for over 30 years, directing more than 100 productions, many world premieres for youth and young audiences. He's delighted to direct **Baking Time** at PHT this holiday season. Kim wrote and co-created L'en Vol Du L'ange for Montreal's Dynamo Theatre and co-created and directed a musical version of **The Cat Came Back** with Jay Brazeau and Fred Penner for MTYP. Kim has served as Artistic Director of the Playwrights Theatre Centre, Carousel Players in Southern Ontario, and at Presentation House Theatre since 2011.

Pop!, So, How Should I Be? and Learning and Forgetting, the International tours of Jack and the Bean and Where the Wild Things Are and the National tour of Baking Time. She has worked with Carousel Theatre, Goh Ballet, Soulpepper, Highlands Opera Studio and Opera Atelier to name a few. As the founder of Black History Matters, she has presented to schools in the Vancouver area reaching over 3,000 students with her tailored age-appropriate presentations. She currently sits on the Board for Nova Dance and ASSITEJ Canada and is a member of the Black Pledge Collective.



Brad Trenaman – Lighting Designer

Previous PHT credits include Where The Wild Things Are, Heavy and Light and The Magic Hour (in association with Electric Company Theatre / Innovation Lighting). Vancouver productions include White Noise (Savage Society / Firehall Arts Centre), Redpatch (Hardline Productions / Arts Club Theatre - Jessie nomination), Salmon Girl (Raven Spirit Dance -Jessie award) and **Black and Rural** (Pi Theatre). Brad regularly designs for Lamondance here in North Vancouver and has been a guest artist at Studio 58 and Arts Umbrella. Other notable projects include CATS (Panasonic Theatre, Toronto), singer Matt Dusk (Las Vegas Hilton), The National Chinese Acrobats with the Kitchener Waterloo Symphony (Sony Centre, Toronto), Menopause the Musical (Luxor Hotel, Las Vegas) and tours with the Virsky Ukrainian Dance Company and illusionists Ted and Marion Outerbridge.
