#### PLAYWRIGHT'S NOTE



s far back as I can remember, the women in my family used the kitchen as a hiding spot. They would cook together, exchanging tips and recipes over stories from their childhoods, and laugh in a way that I noticed they didn't around their husbands, brothers, fathers. I would sit with them, taking in their jokes and songs, old movie references and memories from school. These were

some of my favourite moments from my childhood.

When I got older, I realized the kitchen provided more than just a place to hide: it was where they could be set free, away from scrutiny.

Dil Ka began as an homage to South Asian cooking and kitchens, the familiar heaviness of the herbs and spices, dense smoke filling the air from the tawa. I wanted to reclaim this space for myself, as someone who is not a woman, who will never be a wife or mother, but who is trying to keep my family recipes alive regardless. Why can't the kitchen be a refuge for queerness, where our secrets can come out and lie with the smoke?

With support from Ruby Slippers Theatre and the Advanced Theatre Festival, this play has grown so much from its original reading into something beyond my wildest dreams. Thank you to the entire Ruby Slippers Team, including all of the actors, designers, crew, stage managers, technicians, production assistants, and ushers from the first reading until now. Special thanks to Tricia Trinh and Diane Brown for championing this story from the very beginning, and for pushing me to new depths as a writer. You're all awesome.

Lastly, I want to dedicate this play to my mother and my Aunt Amber, whose playful conversations in our tiny Karachi kitchen served as the heart of this story. I hope to be as strong and fearless as them one day.

#### DIRECTOR'S NOTE

il Ka translates to "of the heart". Heart is the driving force of this story.

What makes up our hearts? Our beliefs? Our values? Our love? Does one outweigh the other?

This production hopes to take the audience on a deep dive investigation into the multiplicity of intersectional hearts. How do we learn to coexist with all the facets of ourselves, so that we may meet ourselves in wholeness? In wholeness can our love for our source, for our family and for our partner meet in unity? May one strengthen the other?

As a queer, genderfluid, Chinese - Vietnamese - Canadian; raised by refugee parents in so-called Vancouver this story resonates with me on a profound level. My artistic practice is dedicated to investigating intercultural sociopolitical influence on queer identity and gender identity. Growing up, my initial access point to my displaced lineage was the kitchen. My fragmented intersectional identity required a deep dive journey into introspection, self-awareness, to meet myself in wholeness. It is still a constant practice in navigating, unlearning, remembering, claiming, holding, arriving, dropping in, centering - it asks of me to sit with it, breathe with it and move with it on the daily. It will be a lifelong practice.

To illuminate the intricate internal conflict of a young Queer Muslim Pakistani woman, grappling with her queerness against the backdrop of her familial duties and her belief system, this production toys with staging Zahra's memories through a series of vignettes; inspired by the visceral text. The directorial exploration of vignettes hopes to limelight the weight of family and belief in Zahra's internal conflict by inviting the audience to bear witness. To amplify the illumination we've built a world in which the language of the design elements are fragmented, abstract and metaphorical; extending the kitchen, the pillar of immigrant homes, into the rest of the house. By utilizing distinctive storytelling conventions we hope to invite the audience to see the world through Zahra's lens, in this pivotal moment of her life in which her internalized shame is in the driver's seat.

The fragmented abstract kitchen hopes to offer a window into the liminal space of Zahra's psyche, in which her perception of the world is blurred and pixelated. It isn't until Zahra gains clarity through her journey into self awareness, does the world reveal itself in clarity. As Zahra inches closer and closer to meeting herself in wholeness, to taking accountability for her truth, she is able to see the world as it truly is.

#### DIRECTOR'S NOTE

This production is dedicated to all the versions of us that try to shrink into spaces that do not have room for us. May all those versions know, they are enough, exactly as they are, in all their entirety.

This production strives to honour both the traditional and contemporary reality in present day Muslim culture in so-called Canada, while investigating the reality of queer intersectional identity.

Relentless gratitude to Ruby Slippers, Presentation House and Blackout Arts for championing feminist forward narratives with queer, immigrant, systemically excluded, POC experiences at the forefront.

Heavily inspired by horror and poetry, they seek to use multimedia tools and stylization to navigate various perspectives. They have written and directed several short plays, including *Dil Ka*, their first full-length play, as well as multiple photo and video projects.

Her artistic practice aims to examine the multiplicity in intersectional lived experiences, specifically investigating intercultural socio-political influence on queer identity and gender identity. They approach storytelling as a direct vessel in which we can share with one another our humanity. 
#### Tanaz Roudgar - Actor - Jaz

She is committed to bringing her diverse experience as a queer BIPOC immigrant to the projects and spaces she is part of, dismantling systems of oppression like a warrior goddess on the unceded and stolen lands of the Coast Salish peoples aka Vancouver Canada.

They are an ensemble member of the improv comedy group "Bekhand" with instant theatre, where they also teach improv acting. They have participated in film projects such as: 'A Film About Uterus', 'parallel', 'backyard worriers', 'Persian'

Pride'. Theatre productions such as: Shahre gheseh (Blackout Theatre), Dil Ka (Ruby Slippers and VAACT), Monologues for Gaza (Carousel Theatre) Hair Hair everywhere (VAACT), Madea (SFU), Selfie (SFU), One Of A Kind (Children Festival) She has co created and performed in Ode To Diaspora at the STAND Festival 2023 and been in residencies with companies such as Rice and Bean Theatre, Carousel and Deer Lake Artist Residency. She has written plays such as Seda (Arts Club) and Womanizer (Paprika Festival).
