Most recently you can hear Amariah in BYU's new animated series Saving Me, and see her in Imran J. Khan's recent film *Mustache*. She is excited to join the company of *Pop! Pop!* with Carousel Players. A recent graduate of Sheridan College, she is grateful to her many mentors in and outside of school. After graduation, Amariah has been continuing her work in film, voice over, and theater, recently received her basic FDC certification, and continues to write. Outside of her work, she enjoys bouldering, video games, and spending time with her family.



#### Michael Williamson - Seek

Michael Williamson is a Dora nominated performing artist from Port Perry, Ontario and graduate of George Brown College's theatre program. Michael has recently returned from Saskatchewan where he played Galileo (*We Will Rock You*) for SaskExpress. Previously, he has spent time with the Guild Festival Theatre (*Alice in Wonderland*), and several seasons with Theatre on the Ridge where some of his roles included: Peter Pan (*Peter Pan*), Connor (*The Valley*), Jacob (*Salt-Water Moon*), and Jim (*The Glass Menagerie*). Michael also writes music for himself and stage productions; credits include: *Wind in the Willows* (Theatre on the Ridge), *Munsch on the Moon* (George Brown Theatre), and *Monsters and Milfoil* (Theatre on the Ridge).



#### Linda A. Carson - Playwright

Linda, a graduate of Vancouver's Studio 58, has been a writer, teacher and performer for over 30 years. She has great memories of performing for Carousel Players, some of her favourites being, *The Last Drop* (by Kim Selody), *Patty's Cake* (by Tim Webb), *Here To Hear* (by Cathy Nosaty and Linda A. Carson), *George and Martha* and *Where The Wild Things Are*. Linda's other writing credits include *Mom's The Word* (co-wrote), *Jack and The Bean* (YPT), and *So How Should I Be?* (Nominated for a 2019 Tom Hendry Award). Linda is very excited about this new creation with Carousel Players, *Pop! Pop!*, and thankful for the amazing team that helped to realize the project. Linda especially wants to thank Monica Dufault for inviting her onboard. Linda now lives on Bowen Island, B.C. where she continues to write and act.



#### Monica Dufault - Director

Monica Dufault has been Artistic Director of Carousel Players since January 2018. Previously she performed with The Shaw Festival, The National Arts Centre, Theatre Aquarius, Royal Manitoba Theatre Centre and other companies across Canada. She has acted in many plays for young audiences and was nominated for a Dora Award for her performance in Where the Wild Things Are. Monica was the Artistic Director of Essential Collective Theatre from 2014 to 2018, where she directed twelve productions. For Carousel Players, she has created live and digital productions, including Tomson Highway's The Incredible Adventures of Mary Jane Mosquito, which toured to Vancouver and Saskatoon in 2019, Ms. Dufault was selected as the Canadian delegate to the 2019 ASSITEJ Germany Directors in TYA Conference in Berlin, and is now a member of the board of ASSITEJ Canada. She holds a BA in Theatre, MA in Comparative Literatures and Arts, and is a graduate of the National Theatre School of Canada.



#### Giselle Clarke-Trenaman (she/her) - Stage Manager

Giselle has roots in the Toronto theatre community and holds a B.F.A. Hons in Theatre from York University. Recent Stage Management credits include working with Presentation House Theatre on *Heavy and Light, Pop! Pop!*, *So, How Should I Be?* and *Learning and Forgetting*, the International tours of *Jack and the Bean* and *Where the Wild Things Are* and the National tour of *Baking Time*. She has worked with Carousel Theatre, Goh Ballet, Soulpepper, Highlands Opera Studio and Opera Atelier to name a few. As the founder of Black History Matters, she has presented to schools in the Vancouver area reaching over 4,000 students with her tailored age-appropriate presentations. She currently sits on the Board for ASSITEJ Canada and is a member of the Black Pledge Collective.



## Kim Selody - Dramaturg

Kim has worked as a writer, director and actor in Canadian theatre for over 40 years. From the fall of 1991 to the spring of 1996 Kim served as the Artistic Director of the Playwrights Theatre Centre (formerly The New Play Centre). During that time he restructured the organization to include playwright development, as well as producing new works; created the Vancouver New Play Festival, the Seedlings Projects, and oversaw the merger of The New Play Centre and the Betty Lambert Society to become the Playwrights Theatre Centre. In September of 1999, he took over as Artistic Director of Carousel Players in Southern Ontario until 2006. He was a Theatre Officer at the Canada Council for the Arts from 2006 to 2012. He is the former Artistic Director of Presentation. House Theatre (PHT) in North Vancouver and retired from this position in early 2025. He has collaborated with theatre companies in England, the U.S., Japan, Mexico, Germany, Italy, the Netherlands, and Quebec. He has been a guest lecturer and instructor at several major universities in Canada and the U.S.



## Kelly Wolf - Set Design

Kelly Wolf is a Theatre Maker, a Set and Costume Designer and an Artist Educator who is interested in exploring ways that design can augment the theatrical experience. She has created designs for many theatres across Canada ranging from small independent companies to the major festivals. Other designs for Carousel include *Hare and Tortoise* and *The Incredible Adventures of Mary Jane Mosquito*. Most recently designing *The Team on the Hill* at the Blyth Festival and *The Last Days of Judas Iscariot* at Brock University.

Recent work has taken her into the realm of site specific theatre creation. With her Hamilton based company Open Heart Arts Theatre, Kelly has worked in collaboration to create new devised performances that ask questions about the society that we live in. Upcoming *Conversations around the Table* will take place as a part of the Theatre Aquarius New Voices Festival. It is the culmination of a two year investigation into the stories of those who have experienced homelessness.

Other recent designs include: *A Christmas Carol* (Grand Theatre) *Pantalone's Palace and Top Girls* (Brock University), *Waiting Room* (Tarragon Theatre), *Quiver* (Nightwood, Theatre Aquarius Studio), *Rukmini's Gold* (Toronto and Hamilton Fringe), *Commercials for Hamilton* (Hammer Theatre/Staircase), *Sanctuary Song* (Theatre Direct – NAC), *The Incredible Speediness of Jamie Cavanaugh* (Roseneath), *The Old Man and the River* (Theatre Direct), *Queen for a Day* – set (Richmond Hill Centre for the Performing Arts), *Midsummer Night's Dream* – costume (Citadel Theatre), *Sound of Music* – set (Drayton) and *Between the Sheets* (Nightwood).



#### Alexa Fraser - Costume & Puppet Design

Alexa Fraser is multi disciplinary artist from St.Catharines, Ontario. With a B.Des in Fashion Design from The Toronto Metropolitan University (formerly Ryerson University, 2006), Alexa has worked as a Technical Designer for Abercrombie and Fitch Co. in Columbus, Ohio (2006-2008), in the Tailoring Department at the Shaw Festival (2014 and 2015 seasons) and as the Head of Wardrobe for Carousel Players since 2015. Alexa has displayed textile and installation art in many solo and group exhibits, designs and sews costumes for theatre, makes and performs puppets and teaches textile and puppet making workshops. Recent selected costume design credits include A Vampire Story, Brock University DART Winter Mainstage production (2023), Jenny's House of Joy (2023), Danny and Delilah (2023) and The Foursome (2022) with The Foster Festival, Mary Poppins Jr, You're a Good Man Charlie Brown, Nobody's Children and Shrek Jr with Yellow Door Theatre Project (2022/2023), and *Pop Pop* (2021/2022, developed in partnership with Presentation House Theatre), Liq and Bittle (2020), The Incredible Adventures of Mary Jane Mosquito (2017/2019/2023) with Carousel Players. Recent puppetry credits include puppet design and creation for Cosmic Fishing Theatre Company's **Discover** and **SHADED** (2022/2023), Yellow Door Theatre Project's Nobody's Children (2022), Carousel Player's Pop Pop (2021/2022) and design and performance for Carousel Player's Culture Days event, Drama Garden, 2022 (This event received Spotlight Recognition from Ontario Culture Days, receiving "Best In Person Program-Runner Up") and for Concrete Cabaret's Exquisite Collaboration (2021) and #7 A VERY SPECIAL Holiday SPECIAL (2020). Alexa has studied puppetry construction and performance with David Lane (founding member of the Old Trout Puppet Workshop) at the New England Puppetry Intensive, the Puppetmongers and CLUNK Puppet Lab at the Humber College Puppetry Intensive, with Frank Meschkuleit and Mike Petersen at the Toronto School of Puppetry, mask making with Michelle Jamieson at the Off the Wall school of theatre production in Stratford and online with Mark Down of Blind Summit Theatre (England) and Bernd Ogrodnik of World of Puppets (Iceland). Alexa has taught the Carousel Players' Puppet and Mask summer camp since 2021

and is looking forward to teaching Puppets at Brock University's Department of Dramatic Arts this year, along with Wardrobe and Props.



## Joe Lapinski - Music Composition & Direction

Joe Lapinski is very excited to be part of Carousel Player's production of *Pop! Pop!*. He has been creating sound and music for theatre for 18 years, and is based in St. Catharines Ontario. Joe is also an active musician, producer, songwriter, and recording engineer who has worked with an array for musicians, and is currently lead producer at WOW! Recording Studio. He is a co-founder of the *In the Soil Arts Festival*, and is a former music director for Suitcase In Point Theatre Company. Past productions include: *Hare & Tortoise*, 2018/19, Carousel Players; *Antigonick*, 2014, Summerworks Festival; *Topdog / Underdog*, 2011, Shaw Festival Theatre/Obsidian Theatre; *A Downtown Stupor*, 2009, Suitcase in Point; *I Know Angelo*, 2008, Suitcase in Point; *Looking For George*, 2008, Suitcase In Point; *1984*, 2008, Theatre Rien Pantoute.



#### **Brad Trenaman** - Lighting Designer

Previous PHT credits include Little Pea, Heavy and Light and The Magic Hour (in association with Electric Company Theatre / Innovation Lighting). Vancouver productions include White Noise (Savage Society / Firehall Arts Centre), Redpatch (Hardline Productions / Arts Club Theatre - Jessie nomination), Salmon Girl (Raven Spirit Dance - Jessie award) and Black and Rural (Pi Theatre). Brad regularly designs for Lamondance here in North Vancouver and has been a guest artist at Studio 58 and Arts Umbrella. Other notable projects include CATS (Panasonic Theatre, Toronto), singer Matt Dusk (Las Vegas Hilton), The National Chinese Acrobats with the Kitchener Waterloo Symphony (Sony Centre, Toronto), Menopause the Musical (Luxor Hotel, Las Vegas) and tours with the Virsky Ukrainian Dance Company and illusionists Ted and Marion Outerbridge. Brad is a regular contributor to Professional Lighting and Production Magazine, President of New Works Dance (Vancouver) and a member of Associated Designers of Canada (IATSE ADC 659), www.batlighting.com
